## CHARITY ACTIVITY REPORT For the period 2005 to 2009

### 1. Health:

Ewam India has been concerned about the health condition of the people in the rural areas, where basic medical care is a distant dream. Many workshops have been conducted among the villagers about the awareness of importance of good health and hygiene. Medical clinics were set up to provide immediate care to the sick and needy and the more serious ones were referred to the nearby hospitals.

In November 2006 and January 2008, Free Eye camp and Medical camp was set up at Toribari Village, Siliguri wherein patients were given free medical consultations and treatment. More than a thousand people were beneficiaries to this camp and similar projects are envisaged. In December 2008, a heart-patient girl of 5 years was given medical help for her treatment.

### 2. Education:

Education is the foundation for a modern society. It is through education that a child becomes aware of the society around him and also of the growing changes in the world. It is through education that the underprivileged section of society is able to join the mainstream and be able to provide for oneself, their family and for the development of the nation. Towards this end, all participating members are encouraged to adopt as many children from the poorer sections of society and give them proper education. They are also asked to provide the students with not only free education but also free food and accommodation.

So far Ewam India has organized four annual distribution of free stationery to the children of government supported and non-government supported primary schools in the neighbouring village.

### 3. Environment:

Global warming is one of the most serious challenges facing us today. Unprecedented heat waves, long periods of unusually hot weather, ocean warming, sea level rise, coastal flooding, disappearance of lakes overnight, all point to natural calamities happening all over the world. To protect the health and economic well being of current and future generations, we must reduce our emissions of heat-trapping gases by using the technology, know-how and practical solutions already at our disposal.

Workshops were conducted to bring about the disastrous consequences of global warming. Participating members were taught on the proper use of our natural resources.

In the year 2007 on 5<sup>th</sup> June, coinciding with the World Environment Day, Ewam India with the cooperation of the local villagers took the task of planting 2,000 sal saplings.
